
Brandywine Conservancy's Community Sustainability Assessment

Through use of an exciting new tool, the Conservancy can help your municipality begin to address community sustainability.

Our Community Sustainability Assessment entails a review of all municipal planning documents, policies and land use regulations including: Comprehensive Plan; Zoning Ordinance; Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance; Open Space and Recreation Plan; Act 537 Plan; and any other applicable master plans or feasibility studies. Each document will be reviewed thoroughly, and both sustainabilityenhancing achievements and any obstacles to achieving a reasonable level of sustainability will be identified. Recommendations for specific revisions or additions to any of the documents reviewed will be included in a final report, as will suggestions for new regulations, plans, and/or policies. The Assessment will focus on a number of subject areas including:

- Natural Resource Protection
- Water Quality and Conservation
- Land Use & Community Character
- Mobility and Transportation
- Community Health and Safety
- Food Production and Security
- Open Space, Parks and Trails
